

**THE VALE OF GLAMORGAN COUNCIL  
(DRYDEN ROAD, PENARTH) (SCHOOL STREET)  
(PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES)  
EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2023**

**NOTICE** is hereby given that on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2023, Vale of Glamorgan Council made an Experimental Traffic Order under Sections 1,2, 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (General Provisions) (Wales) Regulations 2013 and all other enabling powers after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act.

The effect of the Experimental Traffic Order, which shall come into operation on the **9<sup>th</sup> May 2023**, or on the date that the appropriate road signs and markings are in place, whichever is the later and will be as outlined in the Schedules below for its duration.

The reason for proceeding by way of an Experimental Traffic Order is to assess the effects of the Prohibition of Motor Vehicles for a trial period before consideration is given to whether the provisions of the Experimental Traffic Order should be made permanent.

The experimental provisions can continue in force for a maximum of 18 months trial period before a permanent Order is considered. Within a period of 6 months from the coming into operation of the Experimental Traffic Order. Any objections you may have to this proposal must be submitted to the Director of Environment & Housing (Ref. IF968 Fairfield SRiC) in writing to the address below or by email to [C1V@valeofglamorgan.gov.uk](mailto:C1V@valeofglamorgan.gov.uk) and must contain the grounds upon which you object. any person may object to the making of a permanent Order.

Any comments in support of the Experimental Traffic Order are also invited during this period. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Experimental Traffic Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that a requirement of any such enabling Act or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Experimental Traffic Order was made, make application for this purpose to the High Court.

**SCHEDULE 1**

No person shall cause or permit any Motor Vehicle to enter and proceed along the length of road described in Schedule 2 below, during term time, between the hours of 08:00 and 09:15 and between the hours of 15:00 and 16:00 on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday, unless exempt, as set out in the articles to this Order.

**SCHEDULE 2**

**Prohibition of Motor Vehicles – Monday to Friday 08.00 to 09.15 and 15.00 to 16.00 During School Term Time only**

**Dryden Road (Part), Penarth**

From a point approximately 15.5 metres from its junction with Tennyson Road, in a generally easterly and southerly direction, to its junction with Wordsworth Avenue, a distance of approximately 235 metres.
