


# SUMMER 2024 NEWSLETTER

## ANTI-RACIST ACTION RESEARCH PROJECT



Earlier this year 12 schools from across the Vale presented their findings after participating in an Anti-Racist Action Research Project over last 6 months.

Each school who participated, presented their action research to fellow cohort members, representatives from schools across the Vale and Local Authority Officers.

This was the second cohort of schools in the Vale to participate in the project where the sessions are run by Rachel Clarke from an anti-racism consultancy <u>Apex Educate</u>.

Members of our chair group met with Jenner Park Primary School's very own student Diverse Group. The pupils shared their stories and discussed the ways in which the school makes them feel welcomed, included, and represented.
