09:00 - 17:00	Awareness Raising / Information Stand re Mental Capacity Act (MCA) An awaireness raising campaign for staff and the general public in relation to the Mental Capacity Act and through the distribution of resources. The MCA safeguards people in the following ways: 1. Safeguarding their right to autonomy, and giving people legal means of planning for their future like Lasting Power of Attorney and Advanced Decisions to Refuse Treatment 2. Safeguarding people with impaired decision making from harm by setting out their rights when having their decision making assessed or when making decisions on their behalf However research suggests that people living with long term conditions that affect their decision making, or caring for someone with such a condition, have generally little awareness of what rights the MCA gives them - for example figures whilst 40% of the population have made a will only 1% have created an LPA. The Cardiff & Vale Univerity Health Board MCA Team are using National Safeguarding Week as an opportunity to raise the awareness of staff and the general public about their rights under the MCA. This will be through social media campaign and a face to face event on the main hospital site to share resources and answer questions.
