Executive Summary:

- The Local Government Measure (Wales) 2011 Act makes a provision for the production of Annual Reports by its Members.
- Whilst the Measure requires Councils to make this facility available to its Members, there is no obligation on individual Members to produce one.

Recommendation

1. THAT, subject to any comments the Committee may have on the Annual Report template, all Members be informed of the facility for them to produce for publication on the Council's website an Annual Report.

Reason for Recommendation

1. To facilitate the Council's compliance with the relevant provision of the Local Government (Wales) Measure 2011 ("the Measure").

1. Background

1.1 The Measure contains a requirement that Local Authorities make provision for the production of Annual Reports by its Members. Any reports produced by individual Members must be published by the Local Authority.

2. Key Issues for Consideration

- 2.1 A copy of the template used in previous years is attached as Appendix A to the report. The Committee is asked to consider whether the current template remains "fit for purpose" or whether any amendments to the template should be made. The current format reflects guidance issued by the Welsh Government at the time the requirement relating to Annual Reports first came into being.
- 2.2 Whilst the Measure requires the Council to make this facility available to Members, there is no obligation on individuals to produce an Annual Report. It is also acknowledged that, whilst Annual Reports can be regarded as a means of improving communication between Elected Members and the public, they are only one method of communication open to, and used by, Members.
