2. <u>Reason for Seeking Emergency Powers</u> - To ensure Passenger Transport Providers continue to exist after the Covid-19 pandemic.

Attached letter from WG (Ken Skates) and further latter from WLGA (Cllr Andrew Morgan) recommends making 75% daily payments if services are suspended during the pandemic and 100% payments if operators provide some form of services (albeit a reduced service).

Passenger Transport providers are limited in supply, not only in the Vale of Glamorgan, but also Wales wide. This pandemic could potentially cripple the market in Wales and leave us with too few operators to provide the statutory transport function that Local Authorities have a duty to.

The continuation of payments would go some way to keeping existing operators. Operators would need to agree to the attached indemnity letter (currently with Legal for comment) which points out that operators must pay their staff and ensure services can recommence once required.

The 100% payments for these services would already have been committed for the 2020/21 financial year and would be funded from both Council budget and Welsh Government grants. Therefore continuation of payments would not have a financial implication, albeit the LA would be paying a retainer for a service that is not currently being provided but will be once the pandemic is over.

This would be applicable to local financially supported bus services, school transport services (ALN and mainstream) and social service services day centre transport.
