

# Car Parking Proposals (Neighbourhood Services)

#### **CAR PARKING REPORT - CONTEXT**

- Background to car parking charges/proposals Cabinet 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2018 and 18<sup>th</sup> March 2019 (Proposed Parking Management Policy 2019/20) discussed consultation responses and Capita Report
- Cabinet meeting of 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020 agreed "Guiding Principles and Charges for Car Parking 2020/21"
- Initially introduced town centre charging, charging all year-round at coastal car parks, country parks and season tickets
- New proposals consider Project Zero / active travel / behaviour shift / congestion / contributions from visitors (o/s of the Vale) and existing costs
- Car parking savings identified and agreed in Budget proposals for 2024/25 (£150K)
- Further savings proposed (Neighbourhood Services 2025/26 budget savings of £2.4m)

## CAR PARKING PROPOSALS - ON-STREET


- Estimated income up to £204k
- Based on a new charging schedule (times as amended Cabinet 9<sup>th</sup> January 2025)
- Capital set-up costs at £159,501.49 (Penarth £69,536.30 & Barry £89,965.19)
- Funded from capital reserves
- Ongoing revenue costs £10k (servicing machines)

#### CAR PARKING PROPOSALS - ON-STREET

Proposes On-street charging at the following locations -

- Barry Island incorporating Paget Road, Friars Road, Breaksea Drive and Station Approach Road
- Potential spaces 150
- Subject to further design work



#### CAR PARKING PROPOSALS - ON-STREET

Proposes On-street charging at the following locations -

- Penarth Esplanade, Cliff Hill, Cliff Parade, sections of Beach Road and Bridgeman Road
- Potential spaces 94
- Subject to further design work



# ON-STREET PARKING CHARGES PROPOSAL

- Focuses on premium spaces currently without charge
- Priority directing users to the main car parks
- Assists with managing congestion and short & long term parking arrangements
- Season tickets available for Vale residents at £2 p/w
- Current costs -
  - 2023/24 net costs @ £1.7m / net income @ £985k deficit of £746k
  - 2024/25 projecting deficit at £900k
- Proposal compliant with relevant legislative framework specifically Section 55 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Traffic Management Act 2024
- Car parking income offsets expenditure such as Public transport/Car park maintenance (£911k pa)
- Minimising impact on operational budgets (£750k savings proposed for 2025/26)
- EIA's completed for the proposal
- TRO changes will be subject to a 21-day consultation period

## CAR PARKING PROPOSALS - OFF-STREET

Proposes Off-street charging (car parks) at the following locations -

Cliff Walk - Penarth Bron y Mor Barry Cold Knap Barry West Farm Southerndown Portabello Ogmore by Sea

Future consideration but subject to a further Report -

Llantwit Major (Cwm Colhugh) Beach - discussions with TC on-going

Not considered viable -

Penarth Marina (Llwyn Passat)

#### CAR PARKING PROPOSALS - OFF-STREET

- Estimated income £220k
- Based on the existing charging schedule (times as amended Cabinet 9<sup>th</sup> January 2025)
- Capital set-up costs at £64,296.30
- Ongoing revenue costs £10k (servicing machines)
- Upgrades to Bron y Mor and Cliff Walk car parks provisionally included in 2025/26 budget

# COURT ROAD MULTI STOREY CAR PARK

- Provision for 224 spaces
- Car park in need of structural works (£247K)
- Revenue costs currently £89k per year and likely to increase
- Will require a budget of approximately £700k over the next 5-years
- Current Neighbourhood Services budget is £38k (2024/25)
- Car Park is poorly utilised
- Charging not sustainable due the costs high associated with managing this car park (Best used car park Cowbridge income £40K / Wyndham St £10.5k)

# COURT ROAD MULTI STOREY CAR PARK

- Wyndham Street, Car Park has a less capacity of 74 spaces but also low occupancy
- Several alternative locations with unrestricted on-street parking nearby
- Unrestricted parking along Holton Road
- Within a 0.8-mile radius 21 streets offering unrestricted parking,
- Numerous bus routes to Wyndham Street (88, 93, 94, 95, 100, 304, B1, B2, and B3) serving Barry, Penarth, Dinas Powys, Sully, Llandough, and the surrounding areas of Cardiff.
- Throughout Barry Town and in Wyndham Street, Car Park free 2-hour parking options to facilitate safe drop-offs and pick-ups (helping with congestion)

## **RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS**

- VoG one of few authorities not to levy a charge for permits
- 4,429 properties eligible
- > 2,123 permits issued as well as 996 visitor permits
- Report recommends that a charge is not applied
- Charges impact on VoG residents only (and mainly terraced housing areas)
- Move to digitalisation of permits during 2025
