Executive Summary:

- The Standards Committee have resolved that Independent Members of the Standards Committee provide the Committee with updates of observations made at Vale of Glamorgan Council Meetings in respect of one of their roles in providing and maintaining high standards of conduct by Councillors, Co-Opted Members and Church and Parent Governors.
- It is intended that Independent Members attend Vale of Glamorgan Council Meetings and report back to the Standards Committee on their findings on a regular basis.

Recommendation

1. That the Standards Committee consider the information provided at the meeting and consider recommendations as necessary.

Reason for Recommendation

1. Having regard to the observations undertaken.

1. Background

1.1 There are a number of roles and functions of the Standards Committee, one of which is:

(a) To promote and maintain high standards of conduct by Councillors, Co-Opted Members and church and parent governor representatives of the Council.

- **1.2** In considering the Committee's work programme report at its meeting in January, 2018, the proposal for Independent Members of the Committee to observe Vale of Glamorgan Council meetings was agreed to be an appropriate opportunity to not only build on knowledge but to assist with the process of promoting and maintaining high standards of conduct
- **1.3** As part of the Committee's work programme, it was agreed that Independent Members would attend a number of Vale of Glamorgan Council meetings during the Municipal Year 2018/19 to observe meetings with a view to promote and maintain high standards of conduct in line with the Members' Code of Conduct.
- **1.4** Feedback reports would also be presented to the Standards Committee on a quarterly basis following the observations.

3.1 The role of the Standards Committee is to promote and maintain high standards of conduct by Councillors, Co-Opted Members and Church and Parent Governor Representatives.

4. Resources and Legal Considerations

Financial

4.1 Members will be remunerated for attendance under the allowance scheme agreed by the Independent Remuneration Panel and the Vale of Glamorgan Council's Constitution. Independent Members are able to claim for a maximum of 10 days per annum as detailed within the Council's Constitution.

Employment

4.2 Independent Members are appointed as Co-Opted Members to the Standards Committee and will be remunerated for attendance under the allowance scheme agreed by the Independent Remuneration Panel and the Vale of Glamorgan Council's Constitution. Independent Members are able to claim for a maximum of 10 days per annum as detailed within the Council's Constitution.

4.3 The Council has a duty to establish and maintain a Standards Committee as defined by legislation as set out in the Standards Committees Rules and Regulations 2001 and the Standards Committee (Wales) Amendment Regulations 2006.
