## 1. Background

- **1.1** The role and function of the Standards Committee is
  - (a) To promote and maintain high standards of conduct by Councillors, Co-Opted Members and church and parent governor representatives of the Council;
  - (b) To assist Councillors, Co-Opted Members and church and parent governor representatives of the Council to observe the Members' Code of Conduct;
  - (c) To advise the Council on the adoption or revision of the Members' Code of Conduct;
  - (d) To monitor the operation of the Members' Code of Conduct;
  - (e) To advise, train or arrange to train Councillors, Co-Opted Members and church and parent governor representatives of this Council on matters relating to the Members' Code of Conduct;
  - (f) To grant dispensations to Councillors, Co-Opted Members and church and parent governor representatives of this Council from requirements relating to interests set out in the Members' Code of Conduct.
  - (g) To deal with any reports from a case tribunal or interim case tribunal, and any report from the Monitoring Officer on any matter referred to that Officer by the Public Services Ombudsman for Wales; and
  - (h) To exercise (a) to (g) above in relation to the Community Councils wholly or mainly in its area and the Members of those Community Councils.

#### 2. Key Issues for Consideration

- **2.1** Attached at Appendix 1 to the report is a suggested Forward Work Programme for the Municipal Year 2023/24 for the Committee's consideration and approval.
- 2.2 Standards Committee Members are reminded that the Council's Annual Meeting is scheduled to take place on 10th May, 2023 and the appointment of the Chair and Vice-Chair of Standards Committee will be dealt with at the first meeting of the Standards Committee following the Annual Meeting.
- 2.3 Having regard to the provision at Section 63 (which came into force on 5th May, 2022) of the Local Government and Elections (Wales) Act 2021 that as soon as

reasonably practicable after the end of each financial year a standards committee must make an annual report to the Local Authority it is suggested that the Annual Report for 2022/23 be presented to the Standards Committee (following the Council's Annual Meeting) on 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 and reported to Full Council on 24<sup>th</sup> July, 2023.

2.4 For the Committee's information, Members' Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards Framework training opportunities will be offered to Vale of Glamorgan Town and Community Councils to attend a training session to be run by the Monitoring Officer and One Voice Wales with a feedback report to be presented to the June 2023 Standards Committee meeting.
